To Sister Bay Parks Committee,

Please consider allowing dogs in the waterfront park. As the owner of Dogma Diggs and Grooming Studio I can say 99% of owners leash and pick up after their dogs. I feel responsible dog owners should not be punished for the minority. As a Sister Bay business and dog owner I have no trouble bringing a poop bag to someone who has not cleaned up after their dog. The more people and dogs around the easier it will be to enforce the leash and waste ordinances already in place in the village. Making bags and rules available will also enforce the law.

My dog is a American Kennel Club Good Citizen and Therapy Dog. He needs to be exposed to many situations and be part of society to maintain and practice his manners -not banned to the dog park. Like most people who include their dogs in all family activities and travel, I don't take my dog to the beach to poop! We have a proper place and time to take care of bathroom routine. We are always prepared for emergencies though!

An activity that my dog and I enjoy are walking from home to the Marina. We would love to be able to walk on the beautiful walkway at the beach and take in the view. We also paddleboard together. Launching from the beach is ideal but I feel I am breaking the rules if I walk him from my car to the paddle board.

Having an organized village wide clean up day is an idea I have seen work in other places. It could be group of dog owners, or sponsored by a business or dog park. I would be a business that would sponser a group of responsible dog owners to help keep the park and the village poop free! Having a group of responsible dog owners present in the park will help keep the leash and waste pick up rules enforced.

To the Sister Bay Parks & Recreation Committee,

Please allow me to address concerns that have been raised in previous meetings regarding dogs being allowed in Sister Bay's waterfront park. Because I am unable to attend the Feb. meeting I have asked Drew Bickford to represent me and read this letter.

It is my understanding that dogs were originally banned from the park to eliminate beach closings secondary to E. coli. contamination. It is unfair to blame beach closings on dog feces as there are many significant factors which promote contamination (rainfall, temperature, wind direction, wave height, barometric pressure). The May 2006 Door County Beach Contamination Source Study states the following:

The antibiotic resistance testing and the genetic fingerprinting of E. coli isolates collected in 2004 and 2005 from Sister Bay beach indicate that E. coli isolates are from multiple sources, human, avian, dog and other unidentified sources (Figure 41, pg 74). This indicates that the E. coli is not coming from one obvious source, but instead it is accumulating from many sources and being transported to the beach. This finding takes the emphasis off of the remediation of one source and places it on remediation of the delivery system that is transporting the accumulation of many sources to the beach. This delivery system at Sister Bay beach consists mainly of storm water pipes and impervious surface runoff discharging on and near the beach. Additional E. coli concentrations and isolates need to be taken from the storm water pipe.

It is time to reconsider allowing dogs in our park now that our storm sewer system has been upgraded and our old, small sewer pipes replaced and the sewer system expanded.

The American Veterinary Medical Association's 2011 study states that 63% of dog owners consider their pet a family member. The Episcopal church, and perhaps other churches as well, invite the family pet to church yearly to be blessed. So it is not surprising that pet tourism is a growing business. Hotel chains, including the exclusive Kimpton Hotels and Four Season Hotels and Resorts, offer pet accommodations. But here in Sister Bay a sheriff asked me to leave Marina Fest because my dog was in accompaniment. I and other friends cannot comfortably attend concerts in the park but instead must stand outside the park perimeter with our dogs. Do not underestimate the importance of pet dogs as members of families - families with and without children, young as well as old. When we restrict dogs we frequently restrict their humans.

The dog park is a wonderful place where dogs can run off leash and socialize with other dogs but it's not the place where the family members congregate for social activities. That place is the park where the family, including pet members, want to walk and rest, listen to music or view the beauty of our village. Restricting dogs to the dog park is like restricting children to the playground area.

No one, including responsible dogs owners, want to see unsightly, unhealthy dog droppings in our park. That potential problem can be managed with positive signage requesting that we all help to maintain the beauty of our park by picking up after ourselves and our pets. Positive signage such as "if your dog poops you must scoop" is a friendly reminder that would present Sister Bay as a family friendly community in which to live and visit. Many communities use informative signage such as "dog waste contaminates our water so always use a bag or scooper to pick up after your pet." (Incidentally, at the marina I haven't noticed dog feces or even discolored grass on the beautiful marina lawn.)

Many people, locals and visitors alike, routinely walk for enjoyment and health. Dog walking should be an encouraged activity. Sister Bay already has a limited number of sidewalks so we should not further restrict access to any walkways, especially the spectacularly beautiful park walk.

I cannot understand the significance of Sturgeon Bay's policy on banning dogs in their parks. As far as I am able to determine it was based on one person's opinion. Sister Bay should make an educated and reasonable decision based on Sister Bay factors and not rely on any one person's opinion from Sturgeon Bay.

Sister Bay should allow leashed dogs in our park. It would not harm our beach and would present Sister Bay as a family friendly community, it would promote tourism and allow greater attendance at park functions. And finally it would allow all of us that live here access to the wonderful park that our tax dollars support.

6 *The December 2, 2015 meeting of the Parks, Properties and Streets Committee was called*
7 *to order by Committee Chair Dave Lienau at 2:01 P.M.*

8
9 **Present:** Committee Chair Dave Lienau and members John Clove, Sharon Doersching and
10 Scott Baker.

11
12 **Staff Members:** Village Administrator Zeke Jackson, Facilities Manager Steve Mann, and
13 Assistant Administrator Janal Suppanz.

14
15 **Others:** Karen McRoberts, Ron Kane, Drew Bickford and Deputy Bob Sitte of the Door
16 County Sheriff's Department.

17
18 **Approval of Agenda:**

19 *A motion was made by Doersching, seconded by Baker that the Agenda for the December*
20 *2, 2015 meeting of the Parks Committee be approved as presented. Motion carried – All*
21 *eyes.*

22
23 **Comments, correspondence and concerns from the public:**

24 Lienau noted that no new correspondence had been received, and asked if anyone wished
25 to comment regarding a non-agenda item. No one responded.

26
27 Lienau pointed out that the time allotted for this meeting was very limited as an Employee
28 Meeting had been scheduled for 2:45 P.M., and, therefore, Jackson, Mann and Suppanz
29 would have to leave early. Further, Deputy Bob Sitte of the Door County Sheriff's
30 Department, who is the head of the Sheriff's Reserve Officer Program, had been asked to
31 provide input regarding the dogs in the park issue, but he was on duty and could be called
32 out at any time. Therefore, there would be deviations from the stated Agenda order.

33
34 **Business Items:**

35 **Item No. 4. Discussion regarding dogs on public property; Consider a motion for action if**
36 **necessary:**

37 At the present time dogs are not allowed on most of the Village's parklands as an
38 Ordinance was adopted which prohibits such activities. A few individuals have requested
39 that those regulations be changed.

40
41 Deputy Sitte explained that the members of the Door County Sheriff's Department have no
42 authority to issue citations for violations of Village Ordinances. The Village does contract
43 with the Sheriff's Reserve Program, and if someone brings a dog into a Village Park the
44 Reserve Deputies have been instructed to inform the handler(s) that dogs are not allowed
45 and ask them to go to the Dog Park. Dogs are allowed in the State Parks but they are not
46 allowed in any County Parks.

1 **Item No. 1. Presentation by YMCA personnel regarding their annual programming**
2 **proposal and discussion regarding that proposal; Consider a motion for action if**
3 **necessary:**

4 A copy of the proposed YMCA programming proposal for 2016 was included in the
5 meeting packets and the Committee members jointly reviewed that document. Drew
6 Richmond, the Northern Door YMCA Program Director, was present and noted that teen
7 nights and beach volleyball have not been included in the 2016 programming proposal as
8 there was very little participation in either of those programs in 2015. If Village officials
9 would like to see other YMCA programming added in 2016 they should let him know.
10 Doersching stated that she has heard comments that people would like to see two tennis
11 lesson sessions conducted per week. Richmond responded that it would cost \$346.00 to
12 do that.

13
14 *A motion was made by Clove, seconded by Doersching that the YMCA's programming*
15 *proposal for 2016 which was reviewed at this meeting is approved on the condition that a*
16 *second day of tennis lessons shall be added per week. The cost of the additional*
17 *programming shall not exceed \$346.00. Motion carried – All ayes.*
18

19 **Item No. 2. Discussion regarding placing of gravel on Fieldcrest Lane; Consider a motion**
20 **for action if necessary:**

21 Don Howard has indicated that Fieldcrest Lane, which is a dedicated unpaved public
22 roadway, needs to have gravel added to it. Howard would be willing to arrange for the
23 work to be done, but is wondering if the Village would pay for the gravel.

24
25 *A motion was made by Doersching, seconded by Baker that the Village will reimburse Don*
26 *Howard for the cost of materials used when gravel is added to Fieldcrest Lane in 2015.*
27 *Motion carried – All ayes.*
28

29 **Item No. 3. Discussion on sidewalks along Country Walk Drive and other possible**
30 **infrastructure improvements/amentities; Consider a motion for action if necessary:**

31 The owner of a unit at the Country Walk Shops has requested that sidewalks be installed
32 along Country Walk Drive.

33
34 *A motion was made by Doersching, seconded by Baker that the members of the Country*
35 *Walk Owner's Association are given permission to make a connection into the public*
36 *sidewalk on STH 42 at their expense, on the condition that the sidewalk design must be*
37 *approved by the Village and all Village sidewalk specifications are met. Motion carried – All*
38 *ayes.*

40 *It was the consensus that if any further sidewalk work is requested by the Country Walk*
41 *Owner's Association a formal written request shall be forwarded to the Village.*
42

43 **Item No. 4. Continuation of discussion regarding dogs on public property; Consider a**
44 **motion for action if necessary:**

1 Doersching indicated that she realizes that most dog owners are responsible, but there are
2 some who do not clean up after their dogs, and that is why the current regulation was
3 enacted in the first place. She is very concerned about e-coli contamination, especially if
4 dogs are allowed on the beach, and is also concerned that there is potential for dog bite
5 injuries to be sustained by people utilizing the parks. The Dog Park is very nice, and it was
6 created because Village officials wanted people to have a safe place to go with their dogs.

7
8 Baker indicated that he is a dog owner, and never takes his dogs to the beach.

9
10 Clove indicated that most of the dogs he sees in the parks are owned by Village residents.
11 He doesn't want the Village to become known as "the place with the dog police", and
12 believes the current signage should remain but not be enforced.

13
14 Karen McRoberts of 10626 Claflin Lane indicated that she believes it is natural to have a
15 dog on a leash in the park. She can understand that dog droppings are an issue, but
16 suggested that signage which says "Thank You For Keeping Your Dog on a Leash and
17 Picking Up After Him or Her" be erected. McRoberts also noted that a number of people
18 consider their dogs to be "members of the family" and take them wherever they go.

19
20 *At 2:44 P.M. Mann and Suppanz left to attend the Employee Meeting.*

21
22 Lienau noted that a letter had been received from Kathy Enquist concerning the dog issue,
23 and the Committee members jointly reviewed that document. Enquist was not able to
24 attend this meeting, and since Jackson had to leave, it was the consensus that this agenda
25 item should be tabled until the January meeting of the Parks Committee. Enquist will be
26 asked to attend that meeting to provide input.

27
28 *A motion was made by Clove, seconded by Baker that Agenda Item No. 4 – Discussion*
29 *regarding dogs on public property, Agenda Item No. 5 – Discussion and review of Sheriff's*
30 *services; Consider a motion for action if necessary, and Agenda Item No. 6 – Report from*
31 *staff on parks, properties and streets activities shall be tabled until the January meeting of*
32 *the Parks Committee. Motion carried – All ayes.*

The 2016 edition of the Door County Century bike ride is scheduled for Sunday, September 11, 2016. In its 38th year, this ride is one of the largest and most anticipated cycling events in the Midwest. The ride offers a fully supported experience to riders of all levels with a focus on seeing Door County at a leisurely pace. This event is in no way promoted as a race. An estimated crowd of 3,500 riders are expected, half of which will ride the full 100-mile "Century" route, which leads riders through northern Door County communities.

Back in 2014, the event implemented a change to support a local, Sister Bay charity to staff our rest area at Waterfront Park. Because of this successful partnership, we will make plans to do the same in 2016.

- Riders will approach the village via the bike path along Hwy. 42.
- Instead of traveling with motor traffic along Bay Shore Drive and through the merchant district, riders will instead cross Bay Shore Drive with Door County Sheriff's Department assistance at both Bluffside Lane and Mill Road. As we experienced last year, this route reduces motorist disruption and ensures safe rider crossings at Hwy. 42. As part of our public safety plan, we will schedule, instruct and pay for these services with the county.
- Riders will then make their way east/northeast through the village and on to their next rest stop in Baileys Harbor.

Because the Sister Bay waterfront is such a beautiful highlight for our participants and is so important to the continued success of this event, please consider our facility use application for the 2016 Door County Century. I look forward to meeting with you and answering any questions you may have at your February meeting.

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FACILITY USAGE REGULATIONS

Please note: all reservations will be made on a "first come, first serve" basis. In order to guarantee a reservation a completed application, fees and deposit must be furnished to the Village at 2383 Maple Drive, PO Box 769, Sister Bay, WI 54234. Deposits will normally be returned within 2 weeks of the conclusion of an event unless the building or property requires cleaning in which case the deposit will be withheld.

Reservations for on-going facility usage cannot be made for more than six months at a time. Reservations for single events cannot be made more than 18 months in advance.

The Village reserves the right to cancel a reservation if needs of the Village require the usage of the facility or building at any time in which case the deposit and use fee will be refunded. The Village reserves the right to request written verification of "non-profit" status.

All signage for events taking place must comply with the Village's sign regulations, which requires a permit.

Any group or individual(s) utilizing a Village facility, building or park grounds is/are expected to leave it in as good a condition as it was found. The group or individual also agree to be responsible for any damage caused to the facility, building or park grounds while he/she/they is/are utilizing it and will be billed for any damage and the associated costs of repair.


Any usage proposed for the basement of the Village Hall must have the concurrence of the Teen Center Board of Directors in writing. N/A Approved Teen Center Board.

If you intend to use a tent prior to the approval of the permit you must contact the Parks Department at 920-421-0273 to meet on site to stake out the location of the tent in order to protect the sprinkler and electric system from damage. Any damage caused to the sprinkler or electric system from tent stakes will be billed 100% of the total cost to the organization. [Signature] Approved Location Parks Department. Your tent supplier **MUST** schedule an appointment with the Parks Department to insure the proper placement of the tent. A Parks employee will be present during the erection of the tent to insure no damage is done to the underground systems. The time spent by Parks staff monitoring the tent location and erection will be billed out to you at the charge out rate.

If you are provided a key to use a facility and you fail to return the key when your event is over the Village reserves the right to charge you for the cost of rekeying the facility consistent with the Building Key Policy.

If any event involves the sale or distribution of alcohol an appropriate permit must be obtained from the Village Clerk. If any special services are provided by the Village as part of the permit they will be billed at the agreed upon rate.

If you or a member of your group drives across the grass in a vehicle you will lose your deposit, and be liable for the cost of repairs. Any group or individual who does not follow these and other Village facility usage regulations may be prohibited from utilizing the facility, building or park grounds in the future.




Samples of potential murals which were prepared by Ram Rohas were included in the meeting packets and the Committee members jointly reviewed them.
