

1 **VILLAGE OF SISTER BAY BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING MINUTES**
2 **TUESDAY, JUNE 21, 2016**
3 **SISTER BAY-LIBERTY GROVE FIRE STATION - 2258 MILL ROAD**
4

5 The June 21, 2016 meeting of the Village of Sister Bay Board of Trustees was called to order
6 by Village President Dave Lienau at 6:00 P.M.
7

8 **Present:** President Lienau and Trustees Denise Bhirdo, Pat Duffy, Scott Baker, Kathy
9 Enquist, John Clove and Nate Bell.
10

11 **Staff Members:** Village Administrator Zeke Jackson, Finance Director Tasha Rass, Utilities
12 Manager Mike Schell and Assistant Administrator Janal Suppanz.
13

14 **Others:** Judith Ross-Stevenson, Rob Zoschke, Brett Guilette, Laddie Chapman, and Bill
15 Chaudoir.

17 **Approval of the Agenda and Minutes as published:**

18 *A motion was made by Duffy, seconded by Baker that the Agenda for the June 21, 2016 meeting of the*
19 *Village of Sister Bay Board of Trustees be approved as presented. Motion carried - All ayes.*
20

21 *A motion was made by Duffy, seconded by Baker that the minutes for the May 17, 2016 meeting of the*
22 *Village Board be approved as presented. Motion carried - All ayes.*
23

24 Bhirdo noted that she actually abstained from voting on the motion which is mentioned on
25 Line 12 - Page 2 of the May 31, 2016 special meeting minutes and requested that they be
26 revised accordingly.
27

28 *A motion was made by Bhirdo, seconded by Clove that the minutes for the May 31, 2016 special*
29 *meeting of the Village Board be approved as amended. Motion carried - All ayes.*
30

31 **Comments and correspondence:**

32 Lienau asked if any correspondence had been received, and also asked if anyone wished to
33 comment regarding a non-agenda item.
34

35 Jackson noted that he recently received a letter from Arleigh Porter, the Chief of Police for
36 the City of Sturgeon Bay. In that e-mail Chief Porter compliments Village officials on all the
37 improvements which have been made in the downtown area.
38

39 Rob Zoschke asked that the Village Board reconsider its position on only providing meeting
40 packets to Board and Commission/Committee members in digital format. There are persons
41 who are technologically challenged or simply do not want to work with digital media, and
42 no matter what accommodations are made for them they will not be happy unless and until
43 they are given paper copies of the packet materials. Zoschke also asked that the Board
44 members reconsider their position on allowing non-Village residents to serve on Village
45 committees. There are Village residents who might be willing to serve who haven't even
46 been asked or considered yet.
47

1 **Item No. 1. Discussion on a recommendation from the Door County Hazard Mitigation**
2 **Work Group to pass Resolution No. 333, adopting the Door County Hazard Mitigation**
3 **Plan; Consider a motion for action if appropriate:**

4 The first step in dealing with a hazard is to identify it and plan how one might deal with that
5 hazard. The Door County Hazard Mitigation Plan identifies hazards which could occur
6 throughout the County, and gives local communities a tool by which they can begin to
7 address acute and chronic hazards. Jackson is recommending that the Village Board pass
8 Resolution No. 333, which adopts the Door County Hazard Mitigation Plan.

9
10 Bhirdo noted that the Hazard Mitigation Plan is quite lengthy, and she simply did not have
11 an opportunity to fully review that document yet.

12
13 *A motion was made by Bhirdo, seconded by Baker, that Agenda Item No. 1 - Discussion on a*
14 *recommendation from the Door County Hazard Mitigation Work Group to pass Resolution No. 333,*
15 *adopting the Door County Hazard Mitigation Plan, be tabled until the July meeting of the Village*
16 *Board. Motion carried - All ayes.*

17
18 **Item No. 2. Discussion on a recommendation from the Utilities Committee to pass**
19 **Resolution No. 334, which adopts the 2015 Utilities Compliance and Annual Maintenance**
20 **Report (CMAR); and review of the 2015 Sister Bay Consumer Confidence Report (CCR)**
21 **for the Utilities Department; Consider a motion for action if appropriate:**

22 The annual CMAR Report and the 2015 Consumer Confidence Report for the Utilities
23 Department were included in the meeting packets, and the Board members jointly reviewed
24 all of that documentation. The Utilities Committee has recommended that the Village Board
25 pass and adopt a Resolution approving the CMAR. During the review process the Board
26 members complimented the Utilities Department employees on receiving a G.P.A. of 4.00.

27
28 *A motion was made by Bhirdo, seconded by Duffy that the Village Board passes and adopts Resolution*
29 *No. 334, which approves the 2015 Annual Compliance Maintenance Report, (CMAR), as presented.*
30 *Motion carried - All ayes.*

31
32 **Item No. 3. Discussion on a recommendation from the Plan Commission following a**
33 **public hearing to pass Ordinance No. 242, which amends §66.1065 - Utility Poles in Public**
34 **Rights-of-Way; Consider a motion for action if appropriate:**

35 From time to time Village officials receive inquiries about the possibility of erecting towers
36 within the Village limits. Revisions have been made to State and Federal regulations which
37 blur the lines between local zoning authority and who is actually considered a cellular
38 provider, an internet provider, a utilities provider or other tower erector. To further
39 complicate things, the Village is a materially interested party with respect to its right-of-way.
40 What made sense in 1912 with respect to granting rights-of-way to electric providers does
41 not necessarily make the same sense today. The Village spent a considerable amount of
42 money burying the utility lines downtown and requires that power lines for any new
43 structures be buried, and, therefore, erection of any utility poles or towers, especially in the
44 downtown area, would be quite problematic and counter-productive. The Plan Commission
45 has recommended that Ordinance No. 242, which amends §66.1065 of the Zoning Code be
46 approved, as it would allow the Village to monitor who uses the rights-of-way in the Village,
47 and require that anyone wishing to erect a pole or tower within the Village limits file an
48 application and go through the formal approval process.

1 *A motion was made by Bhirdo, seconded by Baker that the Village Board approves Ordinance No. 242,*
2 *which amends §66.1065 of the Zoning Code with respect to Utilities in Rights-of-Way as presented.*
3 *Motion carried – All ayes.*
4

5 **Item No. 4. Discussion on a recommendation from the Finance and Utilities Committees**
6 **regarding the award of a contract for engineering services with respect to installation of**
7 **sanitary, water, and storm sewer service on the Braun property; Consider a motion for**
8 **action if appropriate:**

9 After a considerable amount of work by the members of the public, the Economic
10 Development Committee, the Finance Committee, the Plan Commission and the Village
11 Board, a Plat of Survey has been approved and awaits State approvals for the Braun
12 property. As it stands sanitary, water and storm sewer utilities are not readily accessible on
13 the Braun property, and, therefore engineering work will have to be done to address those
14 issues. The Utilities Committee recommended that proposals be solicited from engineering
15 firms for the required work, and has also recommended that the apparent low bidder be
16 awarded a contract. This issue was addressed at the last Board Meeting, and the decision
17 was made that this Agenda item should be tabled until proposals were actually received.
18 Proposals have now been received, and an applicable Bid Tabulation Sheet was included in
19 the meeting packets. The apparent low bidder was Robert E. Lee & Associates.
20

21 *A motion was made by Clove, seconded by Bhirdo that the Village Board awards a contract for utilities*
22 *engineering services for the Braun Property to Robert E. Lee & Associates in the amount of*
23 *\$14,550.00, and authorizes withdrawal of those funds from the Unassigned Fund Balance. Motion*
24 *carried – All ayes.*
25

26 **Item No. 5. Discussion regarding amendment of the Sister Bay Board of Trustees By-Laws,**
27 **as well as the Sister Bay Committee and Commission By-Laws; Consider appropriate**
28 **motions for action if appropriate:**

29 The Board of Trustees By-Laws and the Committee and Commission By-Laws were revised
30 in accord with the Board's directives, and drafts of both of those documents were included in
31 the meeting packets. The Board members jointly reviewed both documents, and during the
32 review process some grammatical revisions were suggested. Jackson took note of all of them.
33

34 *Enquist requested that the name of the Teen Center Board be changed to the "Youth Center Board",*
35 *and it was the consensus that this will be acceptable.*
36

37 *It was the consensus that a paragraph shall be included in the By-Laws which states that meeting*
38 *packets will be provided to all Board and Committee/Commission members in digital format. If a*
39 *Board or Committee/Commission member desires to print his/her own paper copies of packets, as long*
40 *as a receipt is provided, a modest reimbursement will be made for the purchase of ink cartridges. The*
41 *amount of the reimbursement will be addressed during the Village's budget process.*
42

43 *Jackson was asked to see that the Board of Trustee and Commission/Committee By-Laws which were*
44 *reviewed at this meeting be revised in accord with the Board members' directives. The revised*
45 *documents will be reviewed at future meeting of the Village Board. Motion carried – All ayes.*
46

1 **Item No. 7. Discussion on applications for various types of liquor, soda and cigarette**
2 **licenses; Consider a motion to approve license requests:**

3 A large amount of documentation pertaining to the applications which were submitted for
4 2016 Liquor, Beer and Wine Licenses, Operator's Licenses, Soda and Cigarette Licenses and
5 official agent designations had been included in the meeting packets. All the applicants have
6 passed their fire inspections and submitted drawings of the premises to be covered, and, if
7 applicable, outdoor seating areas, outdoor serving locations, picnic areas and beer gardens
8 have been delineated.

9
10 *At 6:42 P.M. Lienau recused himself due to a potential conflict of interest, and requested that Jackson*
11 *chair the meeting while this agenda item was addressed. Bhirdo also recused herself due to a potential*
12 *conflict of interest, and both of them had seats in the audience.*

13
14 *Jackson complied with Lienau's request, and subsequently read the names of all the businesses for*
15 *which applications for Class A Beer & Liquor Licenses, Class B Beer & Liquor Licenses, Special B*
16 *Licenses, 300 Seat B Licenses, Class A Beer Licenses, and Class B Beer & Class C Wine Licenses had*
17 *been submitted aloud, and also read the names of the designated agents for those businesses aloud.*

18
19 *A motion was made by Clove, seconded by Baker that the Village Board approves all the Beer, Wine*
20 *and Liquor License Applications which were included in the meeting packets as presented. A list of all*
21 *the applicants and their official owner/agent designations is hereby attached and incorporated by*
22 *reference. Motion carried – All ayes.*

23
24 *A motion was made by Clove, seconded by Baker that the Village Board designates all the persons who*
25 *are named on the previously mentioned Beer, Wine & Liquor License Application Listing as the*
26 *official agents/owners for the designated establishments. Motion carried – All ayes.*

27
28 Jackson read the names of all the individuals who had submitted applications for Operator's
29 Licenses aloud. During the review process Bhirdo noted that Angela LaPlant should be
30 removed from the Operator's License list for Bhirdo's, and Lienau requested that Monica
31 Petqulu [sp?] be added to Sister Bay Mobil's Operator's List.

32
33 *A motion was made by Clove, seconded by Baker that Operator's Licenses shall be issued to all the*
34 *persons named on the 2016 Operator License Applicant Listing which was included in the packets on*
35 *the condition that all required documentation is provided to the Village Clerk. A copy of the revised*
36 *Operator License Applicant Listing is hereby attached and incorporated by reference. Motion carried*
37 *– All ayes.*

38
39 Jackson then read the names of all the businesses for which Soda License Applications had
40 been submitted aloud.

41
42 *A motion was made by Baker, seconded by Bell that the Village Board approves of the issuance of Soda*
43 *Licenses to all the establishments named on the 2016 Soda Applicant Listing which was included in*
44 *the meeting packets. A copy of that document is hereby attached and incorporated by reference. Motion*
45 *carried – All ayes.*

46
47 Jackson then read the names of all the businesses for which Cigarette License Applications
48 had been submitted aloud.

1 *A motion was made by Baker, seconded by Bell that the Village Board approves of the issuance of*
2 *Cigarette Licenses to all the establishments named on the 2016 Cigarette Applicant Listing which was*
3 *included in the meeting packets. A copy of that document is likewise hereby attached and incorporated*
4 *by reference. Motion carried – All ayes.*

5
6 *Bell suggested that the spelling of Sister Bay Mobil be corrected on all the previously mentioned lists,*
7 *and it was the consensus that this shall occur.*

8
9 *At 6:50 P.M. Lienau and Bhirdo returned to the table and Lienau resumed his duties.*

10
11 *Lienau and Bhirdo noted that they believe the title “Cigarette License” should be changed to “Tobacco*
12 *License”. Jackson was asked to review the applicable State licensing regulations. He will report his*
13 *findings at a future meeting of the Village Board.*

14
15 **Item No. 8. Discussion on a recommendation from the Parks Committee to amend the**
16 **Parks and Facilities Use Fee Schedule; Consider a motion for action if appropriate:**

17 *The Waterfront Oversight Committee examined the current fee schedule for use of Village*
18 *parklands and facilities, and after much deliberation recommended significant changes to*
19 *that fee structure. The Parks Committee considered the Waterfront Oversight Committee’s*
20 *recommendations, and after making a few revisions has recommended that the fee schedules*
21 *which were included in the meeting packets be approved.*

22
23 *Bhirdo noted that she has concerns about including the gazebo in Waterfront Park on the*
24 *Facility Use Fee Schedule as that is really the only open air structure the Village has. She*
25 *believes the gazebo should be readily available to the members of the public, and, therefore,*
26 *should be excluded from the Fee Schedule. Discussion took place regarding this issue, and it*
27 *was eventually the consensus that the gazebo should remain on the Fee Schedule.*

28
29 *Lienau and Clove stated that they believe the Parks Committee recommended that a time limit be*
30 *established on how long a portion of the beach would actually be reserved for weddings, and Suppanz*
31 *was asked to check the recording of the June Parks Committee Meeting and amend the Wedding and*
32 *Tented Event Use Fee Schedule accordingly.*

33
34 *A motion was made by Bhirdo, seconded by Clove that the Village Board adopts the updated Facility*
35 *and Wedding and Tented Event Use Fee Schedules which were included in the meeting packets as*
36 *amended at this meeting. Motion carried – All ayes.*

37
38 **Item No. 6. Presentation of an award of recognition to Scott Baker for his tenure on the**
39 **Door County Economic Development Corporation Board of Directors by Bill Chaudoir:**

40 *Bill Chaudoir thanked Scott Baker for his years of service on the Door County Economic*
41 *Development Corporation Board of Directors, and presented a plaque and a gift certificate to*
42 *him.*

43
44 **Item No. 9. Discussion regarding proposals from Schenck for utility rate studies and Chart**
45 **of Accounts work; Consider appropriate motions for action:**

46 *Due to staff vacancies and changes Rass has recommended that Schenck, SC be retained to*
47 *assist with the transition to a chart of accounts which is consistent with the State’s Uniform*
48 *Chart of Accounts and perform a wastewater and collection analysis on behalf of the Utilities*

1 Department. Copies of engagement letters for the previously mentioned consulting services
2 which were received from the Village's Auditors, Virginia Hinz and Amber Drewieske of
3 Schenck, SC were included in the meeting packets, and the Board members jointly reviewed
4 those documents.

5
6 *A motion was made by Bhirdo, seconded by Duffy that the Village Board accepts the recommendation*
7 *of the Finance Director and agrees to engage Schenck, SC to assist with the transition to a chart of*
8 *accounts which is consistent with the State's Uniform Chart of Accounts and perform a wastewater*
9 *and collection cash flow and user charge study on behalf of the Sister Bay Utilities Department.*
10 *Motion carried - All ayes.*

11
12 **Item No. 10. Discussion on a recommendation from the Village Administrator to amend**
13 **the Building and Zoning Fee Schedule and expand the contract for services with**
14 **Inspection Specialists; Consider a motion for action if appropriate:**

15 Jackson noted that after working with the current Zoning and Development Fee Schedule he
16 has come to the conclusion that some items on that schedule are under-charged, and other
17 items are over-charged. A draft of a revised Zoning and Development Fee Schedule was
18 included in the meeting packets, and the Board members jointly reviewed that document.
19 During the review process a few revisions were suggested and Jackson took note of all of
20 them. He will see that a revised draft of the Zoning and Development Fee Schedule is
21 included in the packets for a future meeting of the Village Board.

22
23 A few years ago the Village contracted with the State Building Inspector to conduct
24 inspections at all commercial building projects which require State approved plans. In the
25 past one State Building Inspector handled commercial projects in four counties, but because
26 of recent staffing and district boundary changes at the State level those territories have now
27 been expanded to eleven counties. We are now on our third State Building Inspector inside
28 of a year, and Jackson hasn't seen a State Inspector for quite some time. Therefore, he is
29 recommending that in the future the Village engage Brett Guilette, the Village's Residential
30 Building Inspector, to handle Village commercial inspections. Given the nature of some of
31 the upcoming projects, this appears to make sense and will ensure that the public is
32 protected from unscrupulous contractors. Jackson is very satisfied with the work Guilette
33 has performed in the past and has discussed this issue with Guilette, who would be willing
34 to do commercial inspections for the Village. Guilette prepared a proposed commercial fee
35 schedule which depicts a number of different fee structure scenarios, and the Board members
36 jointly reviewed that document.

37
38 *A motion was made by Clove, seconded by Bhirdo that Brett Guilette of Inspection Specialists shall be*
39 *retained to conduct inspections at all commercial projects requiring State approved plans in the*
40 *Village, and the fee schedule which was included in the meeting packets and is labeled "Fee #2" shall*
41 *be adopted. Motion carried - All ayes.*

42
43 **Item No. 11. Consider a motion to set a date to hold a Trustee Work Session on Capital**
44 **Improvement Goal and Public Policy Setting:**

45 It was the consensus that the next Trustee Work Session on Capital Improvement Goal and
46 Public Policy Setting shall be conducted on Tuesday, August 9, 2016 at 6:00 P.M.

1 **Item No. 12. Consider a motion to discuss and confirm President Lienau's**
2 **Committee/Commission appointments:**

3 Lienau is recommending that Enquist be appointed to replace Denise Bhirdo as the Village
4 Board Liaison on the SBAA Board of Directors.

5
6 *A motion was made by Clove, seconded by Baker that Kathy Enquist shall replace Denise Bhirdo as*
7 *the Village Board Liaison on the SBAA Board of Directors. Motion carried - All ayes.*

8
9 **Item No. 13. Report on County activities from the County Supervisor Dave Lienau:**

10 Lienau noted that June is a very "light" month on the County level, and, therefore, he didn't
11 have anything new to report.

12
13 *At 7:52 P.M. a brief recess was taken and the Board members reconvened at 7:59 P.M.*

14
15 **Item No. 16. Consider a motion to convene into executive session pursuant to Wis. Stats.,**
16 **§19.85(1)(e) to deliberate or negotiate the purchase of public properties, the investment of**
17 **public funds, or conduct other specified public business, whenever competitive or**
18 **bargaining reasons require a closed session:**

19 *At 8:04 P.M. a motion was made by Bhirdo, seconded by Duffy that the Village Board convene into*
20 *executive session pursuant to Wis. Stats., §19.85(1)(e) to deliberate or negotiate the purchase of public*
21 *properties, the investment of public funds, or conduct other specified public business, whenever*
22 *competitive or bargaining reasons require a closed session.*

23
24 *A roll call vote was taken on that motion and the Board members voted in the following fashion:*

25
26 *Baker - Aye; Bell - Aye; Bhirdo - Aye; Clove - Aye; Duffy - Aye; Enquist - Aye; Lienau - Aye*

27
28 *Motion carried.*

29
30 **Item No. 17. Consider a motion to reconvene into open session:**

31 *At 9:40 P.M. a motion was made by Lienau, seconded by Baker that the Village Board reconvene into*
32 *open session.*

33
34 *Another roll call vote was taken on that motion and the Board members again voted in the following*
35 *fashion:*

37 *Baker - Aye; Bell - Aye; Bhirdo - Aye; Clove - Aye; Duffy - Aye; Enquist - Aye; Lienau - Aye*

38
39 *Motion carried.*

40
41 **Item No. 18. Consider a motion to take action, if required:**

42 *A motion was made by Lienau, seconded by Baker that staff members are directed to take the actions*
43 *which were discussed in closed session. Motion carried - All ayes.*

44
45 **Item No. 14. Review of the financial statements and consideration of a motion to approve**
46 **the monthly bills:**

47 Payment Approval Reports for the period May 17, 2016 through June 20, 2016 were included
48 in the meeting packets, and the Board members jointly reviewed those documents.

1 *A motion was made by Lienau, seconded by Clove that the monthly bills depicted on the reports which*
2 *were included in the meeting packets totaling \$305,444.27 are all approved. Motion carried – All ayes.*
3

4 **Item No. 15. Report by the Village Administrator on Village activities and projects:**

5 Jackson noted that his Administrator's Report was included in the meeting packets. In that
6 document he points out the following items:

- 7 • Work on the Bay Shore Drive Project is complete!!!!
- 8 • Pat Hockers has completed some top soil removal on the sledding hill.
- 9 • Employees from JJR came up to conduct the spring beach inspection on June 16, 2016.
- 10 • Staff is working to develop some narrative signage for the beach so that visitors will
11 have the opportunity to learn about some of the less obvious features of the beach
12 project.
- 13 • Engineering work is 95% complete for the Harbor View Project.
- 14 • The closing was conducted on the Stony Ridge Project and a pre-construction meeting
15 took place yesterday.
- 16 • State approved plans have been received for the Wayfinding Signage Project. To date
17 two bids have been received for the required work, and this matter will be referred to
18 the Finance and Parks Committees.
