OFFENSES AND MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Sec. 34.1 Offenses against state law subject to forfeiture.

(a) The following state statutes are adopted and incorporated as if fully set forth in this section by reference. The penalty for violation of these statutes shall be limited to a forfeiture from \$1.00 to \$500.00 and the bond therefore shall be as specified on the bond schedule on file in the village.

- (b) For purposes of charging and prosecution of any forfeiture action under this Code, the Village adopts Wis. Stats. § 939.05, party to a crime, and Wis. Stats. § 939.32, attempt.

Sec. 34.2 Discharge of dangerous weapons.

(a) Definitions. The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this section, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this subsection, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Dangerous weapon has the definition assigned by Wis. Stats. § 939.22(10) and any subsequent or revised version thereof.

(d) Penalty. Any person violating any provision
of this section shall be subject to a forfei-
ture not to exceed Three Hundred and
no/100 (\$300.00) Dollars.

5 (b) Discharge of dangerous weapons prohib-
6 ited. No person, except the following enu-
7 merated in this subsection, shall discharge
8 any dangerous weapon within the Village:

9 (1) Peace officers, when discharging a
10 dangerous weapon is necessary in the
11 performance of their duties.

12 (2) Federal law enforcement officers,
13 when discharging a dangerous
14 weapon is necessary in the perform-
15 ance of their duties.

16 (3) Members of the Armed Forces, in-
17 cluding National Guard and military
18 reserve members, while on assign-
19 ment under military orders and when
20 discharging a dangerous weapon is
21 necessary in the performance of their
22 duties.

23 (4) Persons who are exercising the privi-
24 lege of self-defense or defense of
25 others as enumerated in Wis. Stats. §
26 939.48.

27 (5) Persons who are hunting upon prop-
28 erty in which that person has an own-
29 ership interest or has written permis-
30 sion to hunt upon such property by a
31 person having an ownership interest
32 in the property may discharge a bow
33 and arrow upon such property within
34 the village for the purpose of hunting
35 or target practice.

36 (c) Penalty. Any person who shall violate the
37 terms of this section shall, upon conviction,
38 be subject to section 1.12 and shall further be
39 subject to an injunction to enjoin any further
40 violation.

41 **Sec. 34.3 Fish cleaning on Village property.**

42 (a) Authority. This section is adopted pursuant
43 to the general grant of authority to the Vil-
44 lage pursuant to Wis. Stats., §61.34.

45 (b) Purpose. The Village, pursuant to its author-
46 ity to provide for the health, safety, welfare
47 and convenience of the public, deems it
48 necessary to regulate fish cleaning upon
49 property owned or controlled by the Village.

50 (c) Fish cleaning on public property prohibited.
51 No person shall clean fish on any property
52 owned or controlled by the Village within
53 the Village. This shall include all buildings,
54 parks, roadways, public rights-of-way, park-
55 ing lots, restrooms and marina installations
